





but it began to follow him everywhere.






The penguin looked sad and the boy thought it must be lost.

The boy asked his duck.




But the duck floated away. He didn't know either.

tested it for size and strength.


He told stories to the penguin
to help pass the time.




Then they packed everything they would need \dots














Then the boy said good-bye \dots

It felt strange for the boy to be on his own.




There was no point telling stories now
